Sub: Priority in supply of jute bags on a/c of Madhya Pradesh.

Sir,

1. This has reference to this office letter of even number dated 17-01-2017 requesting you to take all possible steps so that the entire indented quantity of 50,400 bales on A/c of Madhya Pradesh vide PCSO dated 02-01-2017 are supplied by 31-01-2017. In the last B-Twill co-ordination meeting held on 24-01-2017 in the Ministry of Food, Chairman, IJMA had assured that the entire quantity of 50,400 bales will be supplied within 31-01-2017.
2. It has been observed that as on 29-01-2017, a total quantity of 28,162 bales have been inspected and passed and out of that only 7,970 bales have been despatched. The indenting agency has expressed serious concern over the unsatisfactory supply performance of the jute industry. They have further stated that if the supply position is not improved drastically, they will approach to the appropriate authorities for further dilution.
3. You are aware that due to the inability of the jute industry to supply the required quantity of jute bags in the ongoing Rabi season, a total quantity of 4.75 lakh bales of HDPE/PP bags have been permitted to be used by the different indenting agencies. We feel that if the supply position does not improve to the level committed by the industry, further dilution over and above 4.75 lakh bales may not be ruled out.
4. Under the above circumstances, you are once again requested to improve supply position so that the entire indented quantity of Madhya Pradesh is despatched **by 7th February, 2017 positively.**
5. This issues with the approval of the Jute Commissioner.
